CLASSIC ANTARCTICA AIR-CRUISE

7 days/6 nights Departs ex Punta Arenas, Chile

Embark on this unique Antarctic journey with a flight from Chile to King George Island, avoiding the turbulent Drake Passage. Then step aboard your expedition ship to explore and experience the magnificent Antarctic Peninsula.

ITINERARY

Day 1: Arrive at Punta Arenas (Southern Chile), and transfer to your hotel. Welcome dinner.
Day 2: Fly about 1.5 hours with Antarctica XXI to King George Island (South Shetland Islands). Board your ship. Onboard expedition staff give lectures on history and wildlife. **Days 3-6:** Explore the Antarctic Peninsula with the possibility of regular landings by Zodiac. Sail along ice-filled fjords and between spectacular icebergs, visiting locations such as Livingston Island, Port Lockroy, Peterman Island, Paradise Island, Cuverville, Deception Islands and the beautiful Lemaire Channel. **Day 7:** Disembark at King George Island. Fly back to Punta Arenas. Tour ends.
