

Transfers, meals and sightseeing as per the itinerary, accommodation on a B&B basis except in Wadi Rum which is half board and onboard the cruise, which is full board, economy class airfares Cairo/Luxor and Aswan/Cairo, Royal Mummy Room & Great Pyramid entrance fees, services of a local English speaking guide in Jerash, and Petra, 2hr 4WD jeep tour in Wadi Rum.

Discover the mysteries of myth and religion on this fascinating tour that combines the ancient lands of Egypt and Jordan. Explore the archaeological treasures of Cairo, Luxor and Aswan and drift down the Nile on a leisurely cruise. Fly to Jordan and wander through the Roman ruins at Jerash, and visit the Jewel of Jordan – the ancient city of Petra hewn into sheer rock more than 2000 years ago.

ITINERARY

Day 1 Cairo
On arrival transfer to the Cairo Marriott Hotel (or similar) for 3 nights.

Day 2 Cairo
Enjoy a full day tour of the Pyramids at Giza, with entry into the Great Pyramid of Khufu. Marvel at the mighty Sphinx and explore the ancient royal city of Memphis and the necropolis of Sakkara. BL

Day 3 Cairo
Visit the magnificent Egyptian Museum, with entry to the Royal Mummy Room, and the main sites of Islamic Cairo including the Citadel, the Mosque of Sultan Hassan and the Khan Khalili Bazaar. BL

Days 4-7 Nile Cruiser
Itinerary as per Days 4 to Day 7 (incl) of the Legends of the Nile tour (see page 8) using the Sonesta St. George or similar. BLD

Day 8 Cairo
Disembark after breakfast. Optional visit to Abu Simbel (page 19). Afternoon flight to Cairo. Transfer to Cairo Marriott (or similar) for overnight. B

Day 9 Amman
Transfer to Cairo airport for your flight to Amman (not included). You will be met on arrival and transferred to your hotel. Amman is one of the oldest continually inhabited cities in the world where ancient ruins and mosques sit beside

modern hotels and restaurants. Enjoy two nights at the Kempinski Hotel Amman or similar. B

Day 10 Amman
Morning guided city tour including the fascinating Roman Theatre and Nymphaeum and the enchanting Citadel. Afternoon excursion to the ancient Greco-Roman city of Jerash. Explore its colonnaded streets, plazas, temples, theatres, baths and the famous Arch of Hadrian. B

Days 11/12 Petra
After breakfast depart via the King's Highway to Petra. On the way visit Madaba, home to the famous 6th century Mosaic Map of Jerusalem and the Holy Land. Continue to Mt Nebo, the mountain-top memorial of Moses and explore the famous crusader castle of Kerak. Next day enjoy a full day private tour of Petra, explore the ancient city and visit the famous Treasury carved into the rock face. Overnight at Mövenpick Resort Petra. B

Day 13 Wadi Rum
Drive to the breathtaking desert landscapes of Wadi Rum. Home to Bedouin tribes, it was made famous by British officer and writer T.E. Lawrence (of Arabia) and is a maze of monolithic rock-scapes rising up from the desert floor. Take a 2 hour 4WD desert safari through this breathtaking landscape. Overnight at Memories of Aicha Camp. BD

Day 14 Dead Sea
This morning drive to your hotel at the Dead Sea. The afternoon is at leisure to swim in the Dead Sea, indulge in one of the many spa treatments or just explore the shores of this unique salt lake 427m below sea level. Overnight Mövenpick Resort & Spa Dead Sea. B

Day 15 Tour Ends Amman
Morning at leisure before you transfer to Amman where your tour ends. B

INCLUSIONS

Amman meet & assist, airport/hotel return transfers in private A/C vehicle, entrance fees, service of local English speaking guide in Jerash and Petra, 2hr 4WD jeep tour, portrages at hotels and airport, 6 nights accommodation in hotels on B&B basis (except in Wadi Rum - half board).

Journey back in time, inspecting the Greco-Roman ruins at Jerash, Byzantine mosaics at Madaba and the fortified Kerak Castle of crusader fame. Wander the rock-hewn city of Petra, and float in the hyper-saline Dead Sea.

ITINERARY

Day 1 Amman
Arrive Amman airport. Transfer to your city hotel.

Day 2 Amman
Tour the Roman Theatre, Nymphaeum and Citadel. Transfer to the ancient Greco-Roman city of Jerash and walk its colonnaded streets and plazas, discover its temples, theatres, baths and the Arch of Hadrian. B

Days 3/4 Petra

Travel the King's Highway to Petra, stopping to see a 6th century mosaic map of Palestine. Visit Mt Nebo, said to be the last resting place of Moses, and impressive Kerak Castle. On Day 4, be guided along the narrow Siq to the lost city of Petra, with its exquisite Treasury and tombs. B

Day 5 Wadi Rum

Drive to the breathtaking desert landscapes of Wadi Rum. Home to Bedouin tribes, it was made famous by British officer and writer T.E. Lawrence (of Arabia). Take a 4WD desert safari beneath towering sandstone mountains and sculptural rock formations. BD

Day 6 Dead Sea

Drive to your hotel in the Dead Sea. Afternoon is at leisure to indulge in one of the many spa treatments or just explore this unique salt lake 427m below sea level. B

Day 7 Tour ends

Return to Amman. Tour ends. B

JERASH AND AJLUN

Drive north to the Roman city of Jerash where the morning is spent exploring the well-preserved ruins. Jerash is one of the largest and most interesting archaeological sites of Roman architecture outside Italy. Hidden for centuries in sand, it was re-discovered in the 19th century and has been excavated and restored over the last 100 years. Visit Hadrian's Arch, the huge Roman Amphitheatre, temples dedicated to Artemis and Zeus and the ancient Hippodrome.

PETRA & WADI RUM

4 days/3 nights

Departs ex Amman

Visit the legendary city of Petra, built by the Nabataeans in 100 BC with its rock-cut tombs, temples and ancient water conduits, including the famous Treasury and the Monastery, Petra is now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Continue with a jeep safari into the breathtaking landscapes of Wadi Rum and overnight at the romantic Aicha Memories Camp.

ITINERARY

Day 1 Petra

Depart Amman by road travelling via the ancient and scenic Kings Highway to Petra. Enroute visit the Byzantine mosaics and churches at Madaba, the memorial to Moses on Mt Nebo with views of the Holy Land and the crusader stronghold of Kerak. Overnight at your Petra hotel.

Day 2 Petra

Full day tour of the ancient city of Petra. Famous for its rock-cut architecture and water conduit system, the hidden Treasury is approached via the 1.4 km narrow rock canyon, or Siq. Wander through the streets of the 'rose-red city' marveling at the intricate carvings,

rock cut steps and the impressive Ad-Deir Monastery. Overnight at your hotel. B

Day 3 Memories Aicha Camp

Depart after breakfast to Wadi Rum, known as the Valley of the Moon, for your 2 hour desert excursion by jeep with a Bedouin driver/guide. Overnight at the exotic Memories Aicha Camp situated in a dramatic canyon, in a comfortable panoramic dome tent offering sensational night-sky views. BD

Day 4 Tour ends Amman

Morning at leisure before returning via the Desert Highway to Amman. Tour ends. B





LITTLE PETRA

Explore the unique landscape surrounding Petra on this fantastic tour, filled with over 9000 years of history. Marvel at Al Wu'ayra Fort, a crusader castle, before visiting an ancient Neolithic settlement that dates back to between 7200 and 6500BC, one of the earliest settled villages in human history. Remains of some of the houses are still visible today. Continue the scenic drive through the mountains before stopping at Beir Al Aris, a fascinating Nabataean water system that is still in use by locals today. The last stop is a visit to the Siq Al Bard caves, which were once used by traders travelling through Petra to store Caravans. Enroute back to Wadi Musa stop and enjoy a cup of tea as you watch the sun set over Petra.
